


# MOTION


On January 23, 2007 the City Council instructed the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance to place an initiative on the February 2008 Statewide Presidential Primary Election to provide funding for gang prevention, intervention, job training and afterschool programs (CF#07-0102). This was a compromise from the original proposed date of May 15, 2007.


The City Attorney prepared an ordinance for a \$50 million tax measure, which is what was called for in the motion (Hahn/Greuel/Perry-Rosendahl-Parks-Huizar-Cárdenas). Further analysis of the proposal has made it clear that a lower amount is more likely to gain the public's support. Consequently, a decision has been made to seek a lower \$30 million.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council request the City Attorney, with input from the CLA, to prepare the documents necessary to place on the February 2008 Presidential Primary Election ballot an initiative to provide funding for gang prevention, intervention, job training and afterschool programs to reflect the new yearly amount sought (\$30 million) and to clarify that the owner of each parcel in the City would be charged \$40.


